Photinia - Like a Schipp, red foliage on new growth, similar size - 10-12ft ball.

Hinoki Cypress - different textures

Andromeda - 3 sizes - Dwarf, Compact and Full Size - deer resistance

Buxus hybr- many new dwarf varieties

Cephalotaxus - prostrata, fastigiata - Deer Resistance

Chamaecyparis Spirit, Gold nymph and others

Camelia sp. - Very selective of variety, southern species with hardy varieties for Long Island
