

Container Sized Veggies

Baby Belle Peppers Baby Belle snack peppers have delicious sweet flavor and crisp texture. These bite-size little beauties make wonderful eating fresh off the plants or enjoy them as tasty, quick and nutritious snacks. They are the perfect size to quickly core and toss into fresh salads. The compact plants are heavy producers, and ornamental in containers. Pick the 3 to 4 inch peppers when fully colored up.



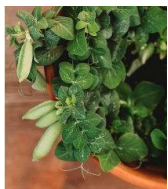
Cut off the stem, rather than pull them from plants.



Matchbox Pepper Tiny, spicy peppers are beautiful on the bush and dried. This compact and decorative plant is a terrific option for container gardens. The plants are unbelievably pretty; their dozens of bright red fruit look outstanding against the profusion of tiny, slightly waxy leaves.



Blue Jade Dwarf Sweet Corn Not only does Blue Jade exemplify the diversity of open-pollinated seeds, but it's also one of the best open-pollinated sweet corns we have tasted. The kernels turn from white to steel blue when ripe, and turn a bit greener when cooked. Each dwarf plant yields about 2 ears about half the size of a standard ear of sweet corn.



Tom Thumb Pea this petite shelling pea is delightful when placed on a window sill, table, or patio for a satisfying snack. Munch on the leaves too! Dwarf peas do not require staking, this variety only reaches 12" in height. Harvest when pods are full, and shell.



Tiny Tim Tomato Happiest in containers, Tiny Tim produces copious quantities of cherry-sized sweet-tart-tangy fruits on compact little plants. The tiny 1" red tomatoes are ready early and excel in sunny window boxes, picnic table centerpieces, and pots on city stoops. Determinate

Micro Tom Tomato Despite its small size, Micro Tom plants are highly productive, producing clusters of small, delicious tomatoes throughout the growing season. The plants grow to a height of just 6-8 inches, making them perfect for container gardening or small garden plots. Determinate



Nantes carrots are known for their outstanding flavor. Harvest of Nantes carrots will be about 62 days from direct sowing when they are around 2 inches (5 cm.) across, although the smaller the sweeter. Good varieties: Little Finger, Scarlet Nantes, Starica



Parisian Carrot is a French 19th Century heirloom that is great for container gardening *Daucus carota* subsp. *sativus*. The Parisian Carrot is unique in both its shape and ability to grow in difficult soils. This carrot variety grows roots that are very short and squat, they are practically in a globe shape.



Tom Thumb Lettuce These small lettuces grow quickly; full-size heads (which top out around the size of a large apple) are ready to eat in just over six weeks. Tom Thumb's leaves are bright green, with a buttery and smooth texture. For steady supply, direct sow outdoors when soil becomes workable in spring until 6 weeks before first fall frost, at 2-week intervals. Sow seeds 12 per foot, then thin to 6" apart. Lettuce requires full sun to partial shade and prefers steady moisture.
