

Spicy Devil Ninebark Is a Colorful Small Native Shrub



This small native shrub has three seasons of interest to brighten up your garden. Its disease-resistant leaves provide vibrant color spring through fall and its pinkish white flowers are a draw for pollinators. This ninebark is much smaller than older cultivars at 3 feet tall and wide. The beautiful foliage is the star of the show, its leaves emerge in spring yellow and orange and then darken in summer and turn fiery red to purple in fall. This cultivar is resistant to powdery mildew so its foliage stays beautiful all summer.

The rounded clusters of flowers line the stems in late spring, opening white and darkening to rosy pink. Very appealing to pollinators as the flower clusters are held upright, once pollinated, decorative reddish-brown seed capsules follow the bloom.
